
THE GOD THAT KILLS



Exposed – Unfolded Original

Okay, technically, at least during the report of this encounter nobody physically died. However, I'm including the details of this encounter in this section because what took place here got the whole ball rolling in a very bad direction.

God gave our original parents a commission.

Genesis 1:28 (KJV) And **God blessed them**, and God said unto them, **Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish** the earth, and subdue it: and have **dominion** over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

There was only one important thing they were never to do.

Genesis 2:17 (KJV) But of the tree of the **knowledge of good and evil,** thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof **thou shalt surely die.**

Everything else was:

Genesis 2:16 (KJV) And the Lord **God commanded the man**, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest **freely eat:**

Free game.

Everything seemed to be going along fine until:

Genesis 3:1 (KJV) **Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast** of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, **Ye shall not eat** of every tree of the garden?

The serpent showed up.

Adam and Eve would have been well advised to stay away from this crafty fellow, but they did not. Instead, they, or more precisely she, started speaking to the serpent.

Genesis 3:2-3(KJV)

2 And the **woman said unto the serpent**, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

3 But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, **Ye shall not eat of it**, neither shall ye touch it, **lest ye die**.

Though her speech was littered with confusion. A fact that Satan was more than ready and willing to take advantage of.

Genesis 3:4-5 (KJV)

4 And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die:

5 For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your **eyes shall be opened**, and ye shall be as **gods**, **knowing good and evil**.

If God was going to hold back on you something, wouldn't you want to know what it is?

Eve certainly did. Especially since it involved knowing good.

What Eve was missing was a very critical point.

Genesis 1:31 (KJV) And **God** saw **everything that he had made**, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the **sixth day**.

She already knew what very good was.

The knowledge that she lacked was that of evil.

The Satan serpent knew this and distorted the truth of the reality as he so often does.

What was the result?

Genesis 3:6 (KJV) And when the woman saw that the **tree was good for food**, and that it was **pleasant to the eyes**, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and **did eat**, and gave also unto her **husband with her**; and **he did eat**.

Based on her human finite logical reasoning Eve concluded that there was no reason not to eat and so she did. However, that is just half the story.

When Adam came to realize the horrors of what Eve had done, he was left with a choice.

Follow Eve's lead into disobedience or allow whatever will happen to her to happen to her alone.

At this point it should be noted what Adam's response was when he saw Eve for the first time.

Genesis 2:23 (KJV) And **Adam** said, This is now **bone of my bones**, and **flesh of my flesh**: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.

Utter and complete amazement.

But now Adam's world was crashing down around him.

Thus, Adam willfully and deliberately chose to disobey while Eve was tricked into the same. Therefore, Scripture speaks about Adam's transgression differently than Eve's.

Romans 5:14 (KJV) Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come.

Thus because of the deliberate disobedience of Adam and the beguilement of Eve death reigned and reigns in humanity to this very day.

Actions – Blame Game

Above we unlocked the truth of how Adam and Eve became the first humans to experience the effects of death. Imagine what it would have looked like to watch the first leaf die.

Or the first time they heard familiar footsteps in the garden.

Genesis 3:8 (KJV) And they heard the voice of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God amongst the trees of the garden.

What used to be a delight now seemed more like a death sentence.

Adam and Eve used to speak to the Father and Son face to face but now things have changed.

Genesis 3:9 (KJV) And the **Lord God called unto Adam**, and said unto him, Where art thou?

The Godhead did not ask this because they had lost their creation.

No.

The reason this question was asked was an attempt to reach into the heart of Adam and pull forward the truth within. Unfortunately, due to Adam's new agenda doing this would be extremely difficult.

Genesis 3:10 (KJV) And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.

Where peace once existed fear now reigned.

Where fellowship had been found at separation now reigned supreme.

Adam and Eve were now exposed to the core and did everything they could to hide from their Creator.

They were then called to account for their actions by their Creator.

Genesis 3:11 (KJV) And **he said**, **Who told thee** that thou wast naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I **commanded thee** that thou shouldest **not eat**?

To which Adam launches into his explanation:

Genesis 3:12 (KJV) And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.

As does the woman that Adam once treasured.

Genesis 3:13 (KJV) And the **Lord God said** unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The **serpent beguiled me**, and I did eat.

We then have the reality of their disobedience unfolded in broad daylight.

First for Adam.

Genesis 3:14-15 (KJV)

14 And the Lord God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life:

15 And I will **put enmity** between thee and **the woman**, and between **thy seed and her seed**; it **shall bruise thy head**, and thou shalt **bruise his heel**.

And then for Eve.




